For good or ill, my vital answer will be revealed in the thoughts, words and deeds I make, say, and do this week.

"A disciple is someone who has simply made an intentional decision to be with another person under appropriate conditions in order to become capable of doing what that person does or to become what that person is." This is Dallas Willard directly.

It seems to be that what Jesus *does* is put back together (at his own expense), what has been broken. Who He is, is God's Son.

We disciples begin with recognition as children of God, and then do what our brother and Lord did and still does.

And then we quickly recognize the futility of this decision without a deepening dependence on God's Holy Spirit to accomplish it.

Desmond T. Doss, Congressional Medal of Honor winner in WWII said, "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. I don't know how I'm going to live with myself if I don't stay true to what I believe. With the world so set on tearing itself apart, it doesn't seem like such a bad thing to me to want to put a little bit of it back together." From *Hacksaw Ridge 2016*

Desmond was an unabashed disciple.

Update: Food for Homeless Veterans

Mike Williams of Holy Nativity, and his organization GY6 Inc. work with the homeless veterans in our community. Mike estimates that there are at least 85 homeless vets in Glynn county. In February our Backpack Team spoke to the congregation and asked for donations of food for homeless vets. The response was overwhelming. They packed 63 bags of food. Each bag had 3 days of food in them. Below is an update from Mike's search for disrupting food on March 14. Here are pictures

of places he went to find the homeless vets and a little about the people there.

"I had a homeless veteran with me helping me with the count and he loved what we were doing. He said it gave him a purpose. He is currently staying with Saved by Grace, but later this month he will be back on his feet. He gets VA Benefits and is 100% service connected with the VA and gets compensated as such. So, when his next check comes in, he will be on his feet again.

I spoke to another homeless gentleman named Ray. Ray informed me he had been in and out of jail and homeless for over 30 years. He has since quit drinking on his own and quit drugs on his own and is waiting on the Lord to find him a house. He sleeps in the parks mostly and eats at the Manna House and the Well.

I stopped in to talk to the people behind Auto Zone. There was only a total

of 3 people there when I was there. A very nice couple that is trying to get back on their feet, the husband is trying to find a bicycle so he can have transportation to and from work. His wife is pregnant, they are staying there behind Auto Zone in a tent, until he can find a job and get the money to get them back on their feet. They were very sweet, and when they realized I genuinely cared about them and wanted to help them he opened up about his experience and people looking at him like he was trash and not worth the time of day. He and his wife both almost started crying when I told them that they were loved by a minimum of 4 people.



They looked at me funny and then understood once I said you love each other, right? Then there is me, Jesus, and the Lord God.

After this we took a dinner break and after we ate, we went down Butler Drive. This is where the Pictures that are under the concrete structures are taken. No one was around but there is someone staying there.

I would also like to thank you and the ladies that have spent so much money and time putting together all these packs for the homeless veterans. It means the world to them to know they can

eat for the day.'

ECW News.....

Our big news is that although we have been very busy during the past month, all activities are currently being paused due to concerns about the COVID-19 Virus. We had expected a very busy Lenten and Easter season.

The Daughters of the King are providing us with our Lenten Service of Lights broadcast online as part of our new livestreamed worship services.

During the month of March St. Agnes Guild collected 23 items for the St. Athanasius Food Pantry and 105 items for the food bags for the homeless veterans. Members worked at Manna House and prepared food for Manna House. They also worked 24 hours at Hello GoodBuy. Members also took sweets to Kathy Lupo's reception and helped with the reception after the funeral for Daniel Coble.

St. Margaret's Guild had a busy month that included responsibility for two funeral receptions and preparation of food for the reception following Kathy Lupo's funeral. Members also hosted coffee hour, worked at Manna House, provided books for the children at Morningstar and collected items for the food bags for the homeless veterans.

The members of St. Mary's Guild prepared refreshments and hosted the reception after the funeral service for Grayson Lane. They collected 703 food items for the homeless veterans and made ten dozen brownies for the Brotherhood's Low Country Boil. They hosted Lenten supper on March 11.

The representatives of the organizations represented by ECW meet on the 2nd Monday of every month at 11:00 on the parish hall. The next meeting may be on April 13th. All are welcome to attend.
