







And then it occurred to me that I was letting the beauty of the past rob me of the joy I SHOULD be feeling that my 18 year old son is thriving in college, my 16 year old daughter is playing at the beach (ironically with the same family she graduated day school with 11 years ago), and my wife is enjoying an afternoon making preparations for a "date night" since the kids are gone.

Perhaps Rich Heffern was right my family too!

Perhaps he might be on target about worship too! Perhaps Rich was "spot on" about life no matter what the circumstance or diagnosis, pandemic, or partisan challenge. Maybe that's the Good News?
